WILD VIOLET

What to look for: low growing, green heart shaped leaves with serrated margins, small pansy-like flowers, blue-violet to lilac or white

Life cycle: Perennial

Leaves: Heart-shaped, often cupped; scalloped on the margins, hairless

Roots: Dense, fibrous system, difficult to remove by hand

Growth period: Blooms March - May, grows best in cool shaded conditions





WILD VIOLET

- <u>Treatment period</u>: May June; fall, or whenever the weed is actively growing
- <u>Control Options:</u> Fiesta weed control is not registered for effective control, but the product can control if multiple treatments are made at short intervals
- Other: Wild violet is considered to be a difficult to control weed. Multiple applications are required season long to effectively control this weed even with synthetic weed control products
